- If you, or anyone accompanying you to your appointment, has had a recent onset of fever, cough, and shortness of breath or respiratory illness, or are caring for anyone who is experiencing these symptoms, or you have visited an identified a CDC high risk area in the last 14 days prior to your appointment, please reschedule your appointment by calling our office.
- If you are experiencing any of these symptoms or have been to a CDC high risk area within the last 14 days, but still feel that you need to be seen, please call our office. Our medical staff will determine whether you will need to reschedule.
- As much as possible, please limit the number of friends/family members accompanying you for your appointment.
- If you are in the clinic and you need to cough or sneeze, please cough into a tissue and throw it immediately into the trash.

Our Team Members

- We are expanding our employee training and we will follow CDC guidelines to ensure that we are maximizing prevention and preparedness.
- We will continue our current hand-washing policy.
- We are implementing a no-handshaking policy with patients and team members.
- Our team members will stay home if they are sick.
